On February 2, 2022, at 9 a.m. in Department 14 2 of Plumas County Superior Court, the matter was heard with attorneys appearing 15 telephonically by CourtCall, as set forth in the attached list of counsel for numerous 16 Plaintiffs, insurance carriers and public entities, as well as counsel Bethany Kristovich 17 and Nicholas Fram personally appearing on behalf of Defendant Pacific Gas and Electric 18 and William McCann appearing on behalf of Plaintiff Jerome Wright. 19 Pursuant to this Court's Order this hearing was set to determine if the cases 20 which are the subject of the Coordination Petitions and any subsequent cases which are 21 filed regarding the 2021 Dixie Fire are to be designated complex cases, and if so 22 determined, if coordination of those cases is appropriate. Further, if coordination is 23 determined to be appropriate, this Coordination Motion Judge is to make a 24 recommendation as to a particular site for coordination proceedings per Rule of Court 25 3.530. 26 This Court reviewed the Supplemental Statements filed by parties in this action and 27 after hearing oral argument from counsel on the issues to be decided by this Judge, the matter was submitted for decision.

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1	1	. This Court finds that Notice of the date and time of this hearing has been given to
2		all interested parties as required by the Order Assigning Coordination Motion
3		Judge.
4	2	Pursuant to Rule of Court 3.400(b), this Court finds that there are currently over
5		30 known and pending related civil actions involving the 2021 Dixie Fire in
6		various Northern California counties and pursuant to Rule of Court 3.400(c), these actions all involve mass tort claims arising out of the 2021 Dixie Fire, and
7		thereby are provisionally complex cases. Therefore, this Judge orders that these
8		cases are to be designated as complex cases pursuant to Rule of Court 3.502.
9		
10	3.	Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure §§404 and 404.1, this Court finds that the
11		aforesaid complex civil cases have common questions of fact and law, parties and
12		are currently pending in at least three(3) different California courts. Moreover, this Judge finds for the convenience of parties and witnesses, the effective
13		utilization of judicial facilities and manpower, and to avoid the possible
